What is baptism?

baptizō is defined as “dip, immerse, plunge, sink, or _____.”

The Hill City Church statement of faith defines baptism like this:

Why do we baptize?

We baptize because _____ told us to.

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. - Matthew 28:19-20

In the early church, every time someone becomes a _____, they get baptized.

And Peter said to them, “Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself.” - Acts 2:38-39

The promises of forgiveness & the Holy Spirit are for the entire _____ age.

What does baptism symbolize?

There are two main symbols used in Scripture for baptism.

1. _____ away your sins.

Ananias told Paul, “And now why do you wait? Rise and be baptized and wash away your sins, calling on his name.” - Acts 22:16

He saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit. - Titus 3:5

2. _____ with Christ

We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. - Romans 6:4

Some churches practice **pedobaptism** or _____ baptism.

Other churches, like ours, practice **credobaptism** or _____ baptism.

1. Do you believe that Jesus Christ is the _____?

2. Do you believe Jesus _____ for your sins and _____ back to life?

“That Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures.” - 1 Corinthians 15:3-4

3. Do you take Jesus to _____ your sin and _____ your life?

But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. - Philippians 3:20

For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them. - Ephesians 2:10
